Joy Elizabeth Mecaskey Caraway, 76, a retired homemaker and business woman, died December 18, in Decatur.

Joy was born in January of 1931, to Barney and Mary Alma Gose Mecaskey in San Jon, New Mexico. Joy's family roots were in Wise County. She was a descendent of the Gose family which settled in Wise County in the 1850s. Joy graduated from Decatur High School in 1947, and attended Decatur Baptist College for two years.

In 1949, she married Cody M. Caraway and was married 57 years at the time of Cody's death in June of 2007. Joy and Cody had one child, Angela who was born in 1959. Both Joy and Cody were devoted and loving parents.
