



## CLYDE WESLEY YETTER, JR.

*SAINT JO:* Clyde Wesley Yetter, Jr., age 93, of Saint Jo died Wednesday, October 30 in Nocona.

Clyde was born April 3, 1920 in Dallas, Texas to Edith Caroline (Priddy) and Clyde W. Yetter, Sr. He graduated from Saint Jo High School in May of 1938, Paris Junior College in May of 1940 and received a BA in business from Baylor University in 1950. He enlisted in the US Marine Corp and served as a Gunnery Sergeant from 1941 to 1945. He earned five battle stars: First and Second Battles of Midway, Roi-Namur (Marshalls), Tinien (Marianas) and Okinawa.

January 24, 1946, Clyde married Sue Bryan Crenshaw in Oxford, NC and together they raised three children. He was an active member of the Presbyterian Church, the Masonic Lodge and established the Saint Jo Meals on Wheels. He served as Treasurer of both the Quarterback Club and Men's Luncheon Club. He retired in 1990 from the First National Bank where he worked for 40 years. Clyde was an avid Dallas Cowboys fan and held season tickets for many years.

Clyde is survived by a son, Eddie and wife, Sara of Saint Jo; daughter, Mary Edith and husband, Butch Eldridge of Era; daughter, Susan Yetter of Saint Jo. A sister, Dorothy Cole of Colorado; brother-in-law, Hatcher Crenshaw of Virginia; and sister-in-law, Sue Yetter of North Richland Hills. He is also survived by two grandchildren: Marty of Era and Christina of Dallas; two great-grandchildren: Ryan and Caitlyn of Era.

He was preceded in death by his parents, brothers: J. E. and Charles Yetter and his wife, Sue (Crenshaw) Yetter.
